

INDIVISIBLE SUPPORTER POLL: WARREN AND HARRIS LEAD AFTER STRONG DEBATE PERFORMANCES

Washington, DC — Indivisible surveyed members of the Indivisible community to hear more about their thoughts after the first two presidential debates. After the debates on June 27, we sent a web poll out to our email list and received 18,500 responses from all 50 states, Puerto Rico, the District of Columbia and the Virgin Islands. The survey asked respondents three questions: Which candidates are you considering voting for, which candidate are you NOT considering voting for, and who would you vote for if you had to pick today?

The Indivisible Project's national political director María Urbina released the following analysis of the poll:

"In our supporter poll, we asked about candidate support in a few different ways and, any way you look at it, Warren and Harris are the top performing candidates coming out of the debate. When we asked people to name all of the candidates they are considering voting for, 86% of our movement told us they are considering Warren, while 83% are considering Harris. On top of that, if the election were held today, 35% of people said they would vote for Warren and 31% selected Harris.

"We asked Indivisibles to identify which candidates they are considering voting for and which they are definitely not. The results revealed that the historic candidacies of women, people of color and LGBTQ candidates are faring well among the movement and have plenty of room to grow as the field narrows. It also revealed that some of the presumed frontrunners may hit a ceiling with activists, given how many Indivisibles say they aren't considering them at all.

"Indivisibles are clearly excited by the historic candidates we're seeing this cycle. Warren, Harris, Buttigieg, Castro, and Booker received the highest net support in our survey, and each of their candidacies fights back against the narrative that only a straight white man can beat Trump. Indivisibles changed the political map last year when they helped flip the House and ushered in a new generation of Democratic leaders. They know what is politically possible because they are the ones who, with our allies, put in the work to make it possible.

"To gain support ahead, the model for what impresses Indivisibles is increasingly clear: unapologetically progressive leaders with clear ideas for how to address the concerns of all people." Results: Indivisible's 2020 Primary Election Survey Methodology:

From June 27 to July 1, Indivisible surveyed members of the Indivisible community to hear more about their thoughts after the first two presidential debates. Immediately following the second Democratic presidential primary debate, Indivisible sent a web poll out to its email list and received 18,500 responses from all 50 states, Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia and the Virgin Islands. The survey asked respondents three key questions: Which candidates are you considering voting for, which candidate are you NOT considering voting for, and who would you vote for if you had to pick today—the standard "horserace" question.

Which candidates are you considering voting for?
Which candidates are you NOT considering voting for?

Respondents were asked to select as many candidates as they wanted in response to each question. 57% of respondents identified 2-5 candidates they are considering. Only 4% of respondents said they were only considering 1 candidate.






Net Support: Considering - Not Considering

Pentagon Warns That America Is Enabling Putin's Plan for Global Dominance

Russia's continued push to undermine America's institutions is no laughing matter, as the Pentagon detailed in <u>a</u> 150-page assessment provided to the Joint Chiefs of Staff in May.

"...economic competition, influence campaigns, paramilitary actions, cyber intrusions, and political warfare will likely become more prevalent. Such confrontations increase the risk of misperception and miscalculation, between powers with significant military strength, which may then increase the risk of armed conflict."

The report's executive summary identifies three goals of Russia's "gray zone" campaign to use subtle, non-military efforts subvert democracies and exercise influence: 1) to [r]eclaim and secure Russia's influence over former Soviet nations; 2) to "[r]egain worldwide recognition as a 'great power'"; and 3) to portray itself as a "reliable actor" in order to "gain economic, military, and political influence over nations worldwide and to refine the liberalist rules and norms that currently govern the world order." The nation's interference in America's election is only one element of this campaign. Russia is also coordinating efforts to sow disinformation in Latin America, Africa, Asia, and Europe; engage in espionage; and execute other multi-faceted acts of "hybrid warfare."

These clear-cut goals put Russia at an advantage over the U.S., which lacks a cohesive narrative as it struggles to combat, or even identify, the threat. "We still have a story to tell, but because we are so polarized and are doubting ourselves we have a narrative problem." Russia does not."

"The Russian leadership's worldview is zero-sum; it believes that in order for Russia to win, the US must lose,"

The report, which was authored by over 20 national security experts inside and outside of the Pentagon, explains that America's "greatest weakness" in thwarting Russia's efforts is a lack of coordination among government agencies.

A "comprehensive strategy," must be developed, including large-scale organization within the State Department, as well as taking active steps to discourage the burgeoning alliance between Russia and China, who "share an affinity for authoritarian stability" and are working to "expand their influence at the expense of US and allied powers seen to be in decline."

The report contrasts starkly with Trump's assessment of the situation, which falls somewhere between bemused ambivalence and abject ignorance. Just prior to the G-20 summit in Japan, Putin described the "liberal idea" — e.g. democracy — as becoming "obsolete." When Trump was asked by the New York Times what he made of Putin's comments on "Western-style liberalism," he made clear that he has no understanding of the idea of the tenets on which America was founded, responding by attacking San Francisco and Los Angeles, cities "run by liberal people" in the western United States. "Sad to look at," the president said.
