Trump's State-by-State Approval Ratings Should Scare the MAGA Out of Him by Ed Kilgore

The online polling firm Civiqs has published a new set of <u>state-by-state job-approval ratings</u> for Trump, and it shows how the president's overall standing (a 43 percent approval rating nationally, which happens to match the <u>current RealClear-Politics polling average</u>) might translate into electorate votes. It's not a pretty picture for the president, to put it mildly.

Civiqs shows the president's net approval ratios being underwater (i.e., negative) in *10 states* he carried in 2016: Arizona, Florida, Georgia, Iowa, Michigan, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, and Wisconsin. If that were to represent how the 2020 elections turn out, Trump would have a booming 119 electoral votes. And it's not as though he's on a knife's edge between victory and defeat in all these Trump 2016 states where he's doing poorly: He's underwater by 12 points in Pennsylvania, 11 in Michigan, and nine in Arizona, North Carolina, and Wisconsin. And there's virtually no indication that states that narrowly went for Clinton in 2016 are trending in Trump's direction: His approval ratios are minus 18 in Colorado, minus 15 in Minnesota, minus 12 in Nevada, and *minus 27* in New Hampshire. These are, by the way, polls of registered voters, not just "adults," so they should be a relatively sound reflection of the views of the electorate.

In case you just don't trust this particular pollster, the other publicly available survey of state-by-state presidential job approval is from Morning Consult, and its <u>latest numbers</u> (are pretty similar. They show Georgia and Texas as positive for Trump, and North Carolina as very close. But all the other "battleground states" are quite the reach for the incumbent.

If you credit these polls at all, Trump's reelection will require (1) a big late improvement in his approval ratings, which is <u>possible but unlikely</u> based on long-standing patterns during his polarizing presidency; (2) a campaign that succeeds in making the election turn on theoretical fears about his opponent rather than actual fears about a second Trump term, which won't be easy either; (3) a big Republican turnout advantage, which is less likely among the larger presidential electorate than it was in 2018; or (4) some diabolical ability to <u>thread the needle</u> despite every contrary indicator, which superstitious Democrats fear for obvious reasons.

If the fourth scenario — a win against all the evidence — is Trump's best hope for reelection, he's the one who needs to experience some fear and trembling heading toward 2020. If anything, there's <u>evidence</u> that he is likely to undershoot rather than overshoot his approval ratings as the sitting president of a country whose direction lacks any kind of public confidence. Even those who succeed by selling their souls to the devil don't have the collateral to pull that off twice.

Republicans need to 'wise up' to being 'a toxic brand,' Chad Mayes says after posing Twitter ? by Rebecca Plevin, Palm Springs Desert Sun Aug. 20, 2019

Chad Mayes, our Republican Assemblyman,, has for years questioned the future of the state's Republican Party. On Monday, Mayes turned to Twitter to crowd-source answers to this quandary.

"What does 'Republican' mean to you? A sincere question," he wrote to his approximately 3,200 followers.

Just 24 hours later, Mayes had received more than 10,000 responses. They were overwhelmingly negative. Among the replies were personal anecdotes, philosophical takes, critiques of President Trump and a lot of biting political cartoons. "Fascinating. Keep the comments coming," Mayes responded. On Tuesday, he retweeted his question and wrote: "Hey fellow Republicans, if you want to know what people think of us, read the comments. It's instructive." Reached by phone on Wednesday, Mayes said he was surprised by the number of responses he received, but not by the tweets' sentiments. "I think it's abundantly clear that in California, the Republican brand has a negative, toxic connotation to it," Mayes said. "Republicans need to wise up to the fact that we have a toxic brand."

As of February 2019, less than a quarter of California voters were registered as Republican, according to the Secretary of State. Voters haven't sent a Republican to statewide elected office since 2006. In California, Mayes said, the party's reputation as being the party of rich, white people is stymying Republicans' efforts to propose and enact policies around important statewide issues, like housing and affordability. "Our ideas are the right ideas," he said. But "we have a communication problem because people aren't listening to us."

Mayes stepped down from his role as head of the Assembly Republican caucus in 2017 after facing intense criticism for <u>siding with then-Gov. Jerry Brown and Assembly Democrats on a key climate change initiative</u>. In early 2018, Mayes announced the formation of an organization, New Way California, designed to <u>promote what he called "true Republican values."</u> In a November 2018 opinion piece published in The Desert Sun, Mayes noted that the number of registered Republican voters and elected officials in California has taken a "dramatic drop" and Trump's statements on immigration, gender equality and the environment have "further damaged the Republican brand in California." "The California Republican Party must be willing to abandon toxic messengers and outdated thinking and adopt policy approaches that will meet the needs of today's California," Mayes wrote. "Otherwise, it will have no future."

On Wednesday, Mayes said this week's viral tweet has only solidified his belief that the state's Republican Party needs a new image. He said he is pushing the party to add language to its platform denouncing xenophobia, racism and white supremacy during its September convention in Indian Wells. "Republicans must reject racism, xenophobia, nationalism, and white supremacy. The belief that one group of people is superior to another is fundamentally un-American. I'll be introducing a resolution at the next @CAGOP convention to put the party on record. #epluribusunum" "If people believe that about you, then you have to respond and say, 'that's not who we are," he said.

A sample of the Twitter responses:

Most of my family and friends back home are Republicans. Their politics are selfish and paranoid. They are steeped in propaganda and refuse to listen to anything other than sources that confirm their bias. They believe theirs is the only right way to live.

Social oppression hiding behind bogus claims of "religious freedom." Which is why my mom is now an independent. The so-called "moral majority" really ruined it for the people who cared about states' rights and free markets.

Anti- women, anti-white, anti-education, anti-environment, anti-non Christian, anti non wealthy, anti-fact, anti-decency, antifreedom, anti-equality, anti-human and essentially anti-American. They are everything the Constitution is supposed to protect us from.

Greedy Old Predators
